## **Protecting Independent School Teachers' Pensions**


The increase in the employer contribution to the Teachers' Pension Scheme (TPS) in September 2019 has seen a sizeable number of independent sector school employers withdraw from the scheme. Since 2020 Covid-19 has exacerbated the situation.

NEU members in over 60 independent schools have successfully defeated their employer's proposals to deprive them of the Teachers' Pension Scheme. Here in Oxfordshire we have also held successful ballots and strikes to prevent schools moving away from the TPS.

Member success comes from early collective union response backed by the possibility of industrial action. Others have learnt the hard way that action cannot be left until the end of a consultation that can be just a tick-box exercise.


## **Save our maintained nursery schools**




## **Global Day of Action for Climate Justice**
